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| <p>Day 1 October 12 Sunday</p> | <p>Dublin. Arrive at Dublin Airport by 10:00 AM where we will be greeted by our driver-guide. The whiskey tasting session is conducted by a trained whiskey experts who explain how to taste whiskey properly including the technique of nosing, tasting and appreciating the complex flavors in each sip. | <p>Day 2 October 13 Monday</p> | <p>Dublin- Kilkenny- After breakfast today we will make our way to Kilkenny. Our first stop will be Kilkenny Castle. The imposing structure is a stunning example of medieval architecture with a blend of Norman and Victorian styles. It's surrounded by impressive fortifications including four corner towers, crenellated walls and a large central courtyard. The beautifully restored gardens and parkland around the castle are a highlight. The landscaped gardens feature formal gardens, rolling lawns and tree-lined paths. The River Nore runs nearby, providing scenic views from the castle grounds. The central courtyard is a beautiful open space surrounded by the castle's impressive stone walls. It's a great place to take in the scale of the building and its historical significance. Kilkenny Castle hosts various exhibitions and displays, some dedicated to the history of the castle, the Butlers and the town of Kilkenny. Then it is onto our hotel. | <p>Day 3 October 14 Tuesday</p> | <p>Kilkenny- Today we will venture out to explore Kilkenny. One of the stops today will be St. Canice's Cathedral which is one of Ireland's most important medieval churches and is a must-visit for anyone exploring the city's rich history. The Cathedral is an excellent example of Gothic architecture with its towering spire (the second tallest in Ireland) visible from various points around Kilkenny. The cathedral was originally built in the 13th century and its exterior showcases intricate stonework, pointed arches and large windows. The cathedral is located near the city's historic center set amidst a quiet graveyard that adds to its atmospheric historic charm. The interior of the cathedral is beautiful and steeped in history, with a spacious nave and several side chapels. It contains a mix of medieval and later Victorian elements. This afternoon we will visit Smithwick's Distillery which is a historic site and one of the oldest and most iconic names in Irish brewing. Smithwick's has been crafting its famous beer for over 300 years and a visit to the distillery offers a fascinating insight into the legacy of one of Ireland's most beloved brews. The Smithwick's Distillery tour is an immersive, interactive tour that takes visitors on a journey through the history of the brewery and the brewing process. The tour combines a mix of storytelling, multimedia displays and hands-on exhibits to explain how Smithwick's beers have been crafted through the ages. Visitors can learn about the traditional brewing methods, the key ingredients that go into creating Smithwick's distinctive flavor (like water, hops, barley, and yeast) and the innovation that has helped keep the brand relevant through centuries. 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| Day 4 October 15 Wednesday | Kilkenny Galway- Today we will make our way to Galway. Along the way we will stop at The Rock of Cashel which is one of Ireland's most stunning and historically significant landmarks, offering breathtaking views, ancient architecture and a deep connection to Ireland's past. Perched on a limestone hill in County Tipperary, the Rock of Cashel is a dramatic fortress complex that has been a place of royal, religious and historical significance for over 1,000 years. Its elevated position offers spectacular views of the surrounding countryside including the Golden Vale—a lush, fertile area that has been central to Irish agriculture for centuries. One of the highlight features of the Rock of Cashel is Cormac's Chapel, a small but beautifully designed Romanesque church built in the 12th century. Its intricate carved stonework, arched windows and roof frescoes make it a significant architectural gem. Inside you'll see medieval murals depicting biblical scenes, some of the finest examples of early Christian art in Ireland. We then will continue on to Galway.
