Day 1, June 4-Wednesday: Dublin Airport- Dublin.

Morning arrival at Dublin Airport where you are greeted by your Driver/Guide. **The group will depart the airport at 10:00AM**. We travel into Dublin Town where we enjoy a panoramic tour of this 1000-year-old city. We will then be dropped off on Nassau Street for some free browsing time. Check into our hotel LATE AFTERNOON. Dinner is on your own, **Overnight at the Camden Court Hotel**.

Day 2, June 5- Thursday: Dublin- Belfast.

After enjoying breakfast, we meet our driver guide in the lobby of the hotel and travel to Belfast, which is the capital and largest city of Northern Ireland, part of the United Kingdom. It's a city rich in history, culture, and modern vibrancy. A major attraction in Belfast is the Titanic Museum and visitor experience which is built on the site of the former Harland & Wolff shipyard and offers an immersive exploration of the Titanic's story. The building itself is an architectural marvel, designed to resemble the hulls of the Titanic and its sister ships. The museum houses nine interactive galleries that explore various aspects of the Titanic story. Experience the excitement of Titanic's launch through interactive displays and multimedia presentations. A dramatic simulation of the iceberg collision with the Titanic, showcasing the events of the fateful night of April 14, 1912. Then onto our hotel. **Dinner & Overnight at the Europa Hotel.**

Day 3, June 6- Friday: Belfast.

Morning departure from Belfast we travel north through the majestic Glens of Antrim. We travel along the spectacular coastline and on to the Giants Causeway. The phenomenal wonder of hexagonal columns expanding out to the North Atlantic is said to have been built by legendary Irish Folk Hero, Finn MacCool as "a pathway to Scotland" to see his beloved. We will also stop (view only) the Carrick-a-Rede bridge, one of Northern Ireland's most loved attractions. Connected to the cliffs by a rope bridge across the Atlantic Ocean, Carrick-a-Rede Island (home to a single building - a fisherman's cottage). Suspended almost 100ft (30m) above sea level, the rope bridge was first erected by salmon fishermen 350 years ago Crossing the Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge. **Overnight at the Europa Hotel.**

Day 4, June 7- Saturday: Belfast- Bundoran

After breakfast, we meet our driver guide and continue our journey to Bundoran. On our way we will stop in Derry. To really experience Derry's history, we stroll along the parapet walkways as we do the "Walled in City Tour". The history of this area and the fact that Derry is one of the last fully intact walled in cities left in all of Europe makes this a must for every visitor. The Museum of Free Derry is a key cultural and historical site in Derry, focusing on the city's tumultuous past during the Troubles, particularly the Bloody Sunday incident. Dinner & Overnight at The Great Northern Hotel.

Day 5, June 8- Sunday: Slieve League-Bundoran

Today we will travel northwest along winding roads that hug the coastline, providing panoramic views of the Atlantic Ocean. We travel via the fishing village of Killybeggs to Slieve League. We visit the Sea Cliffs. Standing at the viewing point on Slieve League in Donegal Ireland an amazing sea vista and landscape open before you. From here we can see across Donegal Bay to counties Letrim, Sligo and Mayo, out to the west is the Atlantic Ocean as far as the eye can see. North west is Rathlin O' Byrne island and Glencolmcille and here beside you of course are the magnificent cliffs of Slieve League. Rising almost 2000 feet from the Atlantic, one of the highest sea cliffs in Europe and twice as high as the Cliffs of Moher. **Dinner & Overnight at The Great Northern Hotel.**

Day 6, June 9- Monday: Bundoran- Sligo

Today we will visit the Megalithic cemeteries in Northern Ireland which are ancient burial sites featuring large stone structures and artifacts from the Neolithic period. These sites offer a fascinating glimpse into early human societies and their burial practices. Carrowmore Cemetary is one of Ireland's largest and oldest megalithic cemeteries, known for its extensive array of Neolithic tombs and structures including passage tombs, court tombs, and wedge tombs. Then back to Sligo for some free time to explore the town. **Overnight at The Glasshouse Hotel Sligo.**

Day 7, June 10-Tuesday: Sligo- Dublin.

After breakfast we begin our journey to Dublin. Today is a free day in Dublin. We have included a Hop On/Hop Off Dublin Bus Pass for each traveler. You'll be sure to see St. Patrick's Cathedral where Jonathan Swift gave his sermons; or the G.P.O. on O'Connell Street, the scene of the 1916 Easter Uprising where bullet- holes remain to this day. Visit the famous Phoenix Park where Pope John Paul II said Mass in 1979 to over a million people; and finally, Trinity College to view the 8th century manuscripts, the Book of Kells, still preserved as they were when the monks produced them all those centuries ago. You may also like to take a visit to Dublin's newest museum, a hightech, interactive exploration of emigration and its effect on Ireland and the 70 million or so people spread throughout the world that claim Irish ancestry. **Overnight at the Camden Court Hotel.**

Day 8, June 11- Wednesday: Dublin

Today we will enjoy the Merrion Square Walking Tour. Merrion

Square is one of Dublin's most historic and picturesque parks, located in the heart of Dublin's Georgian district. This walking tour will guide you through the key highlights of Merrion Square, exploring its history, architecture, and notable figures. You will see the Oscar Wilde Memorial, A colorful and whimsical memorial dedicated to one of Ireland's most famous playwrights and poets. Merrion Square is surrounded by stunning Georgian buildings with classical facades. Located a short walk from Merrion Square, the National gallery of Ireland houses a vast collection of Irish and European art. The seat of the Irish Parliament, located just across from Merrion Square. This evening you may want to get a pint at anyone of the many local pubs. **Overnight at the Camden Court Hotel.**

Day 9, June 12- Thursday: Dublin.

Today you have the option of experiencing Bloomsday Fest in Dublin. Tickets are not included but can be purchased ahead of time after Jan. 1 2025, www.bloomsdayfestival.ie The festival is a celebration of James Joyce's *Ulysses*, a novel set in Dublin and considered one of the greatest literary works of the 20th century. Held in June each year, the festival commemorates the day in 1904 when the novel's events take place. The festival includes a variety of events, including readings, performances, a guided tour that follows the paths of Leopold Bloom and other characters from *Ulysses*. End your day with Literary pub crawl, A tour combining Joyce's Dublin locations with readings and performances in some of Dublin's historic pubs. **Overnight at the Camden Court Hotel.**

Day 10, June 13- Friday: Dublin Airport.

After breakfast we transfer to Dublin Airport for our flight home. Arrive home the same day. In the true Irish Tradition, we wish you a "Safe Home". Still time for duty free shopping at Dublin Airport.
