On our way we will make a stop in Ennis, which is a charming lively town known for its rich history, vibrant culture, and welcoming atmosphere. After lunch we will continue onto Killarney which is a picturesque town located in County Kerry. The town is a popular destination for visitors due to its mix of stunning landscapes, historic sites, and a friendly, welcoming atmosphere.
